 - a. **S20RC001: A recommendation to create a program for students with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD) at Oklahoma State University.**
 - i. Hoelting: What is the scale of the program and what is it at Oklahoma State?
 1. Scale is usually very small. About 8 per year, we are looking at 10 to 15 and leveling at 12 per year at OSU.
 - ii. Allen: Do you have idea where you want to house the members and what’s your cost and would it affect us on fee side?
 1. Sponsors of the program from Arts and Sciences, so it would be out of that college. No idea about the location but they would have on campus housing. This is a nonprofit so the program can build in size and by the end of the 4

year funding it should be a self-sustaining program, students pay the same thing as everyone here that lives on campus with a meal plan, then there is an addition fee to the students in the program. There is no additional cost to the students on this campus not in the program.

- iii. Murphey: Is there a scholarship program for the extra fee?
 - 1. NSU has seen a shift in some scholarship so that scholarships are available to these students. We have a contract in place with NSU to help offset the cost. 277 programs and only 1 in OK when we started but we are working on growing that number, we do it through braided funding.
- iv. Fowler: Is there opportunity for students to volunteer?
 - 1. Want students to interact whether it is through mentors or tutors, student support is important and the only thing it requires from students volunteering is time.

 - 1. Any student that has a heart to make a difference in these students lives. They have mostly been isolated without friends and it means a lot to them to have that interaction.

 - 1. No, we are looking for funding through difference sources separate from sponsors.
