2. Dining services is self-sufficient, so they don't get any fees, would we not be hurting students who work for them?
 - a. Maybe but I doubt that because you have to go off campus. So those on campus can still compete because they are close. You aren't able to spend the meal plan anywhere else, so as an "ag school" it shows that we can compete. If as a student, if you could spend the meal plan elsewhere, they would be more likely to buy a meal plan, it offers incentive for students to get a meal plan, the university won't be losing any money because of convenience. A lot of it will still be spent on campus so the university shouldn't lose as much money as it seems.

1. Yes, we could lower prices, but we are trying to have a recommendation that makes up any of the revenue that they might lose if they offer cheaper options or not requiring students to get a meal plan.
