    - 1. We educate on government and issues, we are non-profit, non-partisan.
  - iv. Kaleka: Can you talk about the professor watch list?
    - 1. Turning Point puts that on.
  - v. Auer: What is the current size of the chapter?
    - 1. 6 members roughly, we've only had two meetings.
  - vi. Hickey: How long has Turning Point USA been active but not an organization?
    - 1. Started last year and tried to get approved last year but form was not open.
  - vii. Murphey: How much does your opinion matter compared to someone national?
    - 1. As a chapter, my opinion wouldn't affect nationally, but I am allowed to have my opinion.
  - viii. Kaleka: There was a message that was offensive, considering what is happening at the top by the leaders of Turning Point USA, do you not think it is offensive to bring Turning Point USA to a campus that is trying to increase diversity?
    - 1. I am aware of those issues, but there are people here who want to be involved and so I am fully against what happened, and we are for equality and we accept everyone.
  - ix. Crane: Can you explain why you joined Turning Point USA?
    - 1. Political involvement isn't very high here on campus, and we wanted to increase that.
    - 2. OSU doesn't have a lot of political debate clubs on campus.

  - l. Heald: Have you said anything that voiced your disagreement for things that have been said by leaders in Turing Point USA?
    - i. Several people speak out about topics that are against their morals if they so choose so.
    - ii. I believe if I voiced my opinion on twitter, unless it blew up it would not be seen.
  - m. Wright: My biggest concerns is reputation, on a school that values diversity, are you willing to speak out against these unjust equality statements?
    - i. The chapter itself does not recognize anything, we would just like to get recognized.
    - ii. Follow up: You just said you take partake with values that it national holds so what values do you not partake with?
      1. Did not mean to say that, really feel it is important to have the values that Turning Point does.
  - n. Hickey: Why did you decided to create your own group when there was a college group for conservatives already available?
    - i. I was involved in Turning Point first and I don't recognize with any party really so it was fit me.
  - o. Hickey: Call for Debate.
    - i. **Debate**
      1. **Proponency:**
        - a. Fisher: We aren't talking about the nation, we are talking about Oklahoma State. We have to remember to allow people to voice their concerns when they want to. There will be disagreements but that comes with opinions.
        - b. Swearengin: Political involvement is not high at OSU at all. Voting records are probably pretty low here on campus. Turning Point allows political conversation and debate, that is crucial for college experience. Without free express of ideas, the college doesn't meet the idea we are trying to push. SGA constitution says we are to provide forum for student voices, voting no takes that away from them.

Voting no removes students' rights to speak out on their opinions, whatever they may be. We do not condone the behavior of the people who speak out of order. Voting no is against your constituents.

- c. Smith: I was involved nationally and have been to many summits. Many people involved that I met are not just conservative. Everyone has different views within it. Turning Point is not just about politics but also for career opportunities. A great way to gain networking and leadership opportunities. The speakers that other chapters bring will more than likely not come. Those protest and riots are those that are against the speaker. It is more than just politics.
- d. Murphey: Not debating if it can be on campus, we are debating if students are allowed to be on campus. This is a debate if students are allowed to have a voice. This is about bringing students together to form conversation and bring careers and networking opportunities to them. Yes, we have seen the stories the speakers aren't the ones who start the protest, it's always someone against the speaker that starts it and wants their voice to be louder. Voting no would be discrimination against students who want to have a vote.

## 2. **Opponency:**

- a. Garcia: We cannot set national politics aside. OSU is involved with that. We have had problems with campus climate lately and we are working to resolve that. Campus climate divides us. My concerns with Turning Point USA lie with national organization. Turning Point USA as a national organization with professor watch list and seek to oppress liberal freedom and they intimidate people to not speak out. I don't want to be on a campus that allows that. Protests happen all the time with Turning Point USA, white nationalists use that to start these protests. The problem for academic freedom and campus climate has increased on other campuses because of Turning Point USA, and I don't want to see that happen here.
- b. Kaleka: This organization is majority white and they are not for multicultural (nationally). They are a conservative group so not nonpartisan. They have been caught affecting elections on student campuses across the nation. There are a lot of different groups without being involved in Turning Point that are very similar that are already set up. I believe it would be a stain on OSU campus to invite speakers like they have nationally to our campus. This is not what OSU

needs on this campus and several constituents are against this.

- c. Heald: When the president was elected several protest started which was cause of that and several things happened. This is so much more than politics, it's about the people. We cannot move forward with this bill. There is a conservative group on campus. There is no way we can support this group.
